The Johnstown Genealogy Society has made an all-out effort to obtain the complete data on every tombstone in all known graveyards. Broken stones have been reassembled, buried stones have been dug up and data recorded, as have old stones placed in piles along the enclosure fences. All "infant" stones have been recorded, if possible, and the stones were legible.

The Society has made no transcriptions from Cemetery Secretarial records or Mortician's records except as noted, and have recorded the data to the best of our ability.

Credit is given to Albert and Edith Smith and James Clark of Granville, Ohio, for their vast contribution to our Society. Without these dedicated persons our books of Licking County Townships would not be possible at this time.

BRIEF HISTORY OF FALLSBURY TOWNSHIP

The first settler in Fallsbury was David Bright, who settled, in 1818, upon the farm once owned by Mrs. Botts. The next settlers were Kiah Blount, William Wilson, Paul, William, and James Van Winkle.

This Twp. was organized in 1826. The first officers were Samuel Varner, William Wilson, and Joseph Frost, Trustees; William Hall, Constable; Samuel Varner, Clerk; and William Wilson, Justice of the Peace.

The first religious services permanently sustained in Fallsbury were held at the house of Eli Seward. There are now a Baptist, a Methodist, a Disciples, and one or two other churches in the Twp.

Fallsbury has no very extensively-traveled thoroughfare, no turnpike, no canal, no telegraph line, no railroad, nor anything out of the usual course to attract special attention, nor to particularly draw emigrants to it.

In educational, moral, and religious interests, however, it cannot be said that this Twp. is not up with the average of Townships remote from County seats and from points of localities of unusual natural advantages. It is reasonably well watered and healthy.

Fallsburg is a small post-town situated near the center of the Twp. It was laid out on lands belonging to Silas Bland, and was first settled by Thomas Meeks, and one or two of the McQueens.
