

Farson, William, estatr settlement by Samuel Beck 1795

138 where we find one frame dwelling house about 32 by 21 feet which we order to have a new floor in the outward room, and the floor in the inward room to be repaired, porches repaired, and cellar steps repaired, one new smoke house to be built 12 by 10 feet scathed logs, covered with oak shingles, one new spreader 11 panels long and 6 wide, one corn crib 16 by 6 in medling repair, one new stable to be had some new logs put in, a new Barn 20 by 18 feet of sawed logs to be covered with cedar shingles, 10 feet to be layed with 2 inch sawed lumber, 10 to be layed with 1 inch board, the fencing in medling repair, no timber to be cut nor ground cleared on to for the use of the place, which we do at the sum of twenty five pounds for Annams good current lawful money of the Delaware State, as Witness our hands this 21st day of April Anno Domini 1794

Upon the application of Samuel Beck who intermarried with Mary Farson one of the daughters of William Farson deceased, and by his Petition prays the Court to appoint five freeholders to go upon view and divide the real estate of the said William deceased (who died intestate) among his heirs and legal Representatives, allotting one third part thereof to his widow, and the residue thereof among his several children, which being considered is granted, Whereupon ordered that George Wilson, George Gumbinini, John Ringgold, Philip Lewis, and Nathaniel Wilds be and they are hereby appointed, for said purposes, who are to make Report of their proceedings to the next or some succeeding orphans Court to be held for Kent County
