Claim of Widow for Pension, under the Provisions of Sections 4735 to 4740 inclusive Revised Statutes, and
the Act of March 3, 1873.

State of New York
County of Potowmuck } ss.

On this 12th day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight,
personally appeared before me, John Young Justice of the Peace,
within and for the county and State aforesaid, (1) Leman Sorethand, aged 72 years, a widow
of Smaile, in the State of New York, who, being duly sworn according to
law, deposes that she is a widow of (2) Leman Sorethand, deceased, who was the identical
as Leman Sorethand, who served under the name of (3) Leman Sorethand,
as a (4) Private in the company commanded by Captain David Sawyer, in the
regiment of N.Y. Militia, commanded by Col. Read, in the war
of 1812; that her said husband (3) was drafted at Tioga N.Y. on or about the
1st day of June, A. D. 1812, for the term of 12 months, and continued in actual service
in said war for the term of 56 days, and whose services terminated, by reason of an honorable discharge,
at Tiagara N.Y. on the 1st day of Aug., A. D. 1813. She further
states that the following is a full description of her said husband at the time of his enrollment, viz.: he Age 34 years,
Occupation Farmer, Born in Plymouth Town, Height 5 ft 7 in, Hair dark brown,
Eyes blue, Complexion light. She further states that she was married to the said
Leman Sorethand, at the city (or town) of Smaile, in the county of
Potowmuck, and in the State of New York, on the 23rd day of October,
A. D. 1815, by one (6) Dinoty Clark, who was a (11) Justice of the Peace,
and that her name before her said marriage was Catharine Clark, and that she has not remarried
since the death of the said soldier; and she further states, that (12) neither man nor woman
husband previously married, and that her said husband (3) Leman Sorethand, died at Potowmuck,
in New York, on the 2nd day of December, A. D. 1875; and she further
declares that the following have been the places of residence of herself and her said husband since the date of his discharge
from the Army, viz.: (13) Smaile Potowmuck N.Y.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of claiming the pension to which she may be entitled under the provisions of
Sections 4735 to 4740 inclusive Revised Statutes, and the Act of March 3, 1873, and hereby constitutes and appoints with full
power of substitution and revocation, John S. Son of Canandaigua, Ont. County,
her true and lawful attorney, to prosecute her claim and to further declare that she has heretofore made no application for
(14) a pension - but to leave a land inheritance in his lifetime.
