Claim of Widow for Pension, under the Provisions of Sections 4736 to 4740 inclusive Revised Statutes, and the Act of March 3, 1878.

County of Broome } ss.

On this 10th day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and eighty eight personally appeared before me, James Young Justice Peace (the undersigned Justice of the Peace) within and for the county and State aforesaid, (1) Leathia Lovettland aged 42 years, a resident of Saugus in the State of New York, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is a widow of (2) Luman Lovettland deceased, who was the identical (3) Luman Lovettland, who served under the name of (4) Luman Lovettland as a (5) Private in the company commanded by Captain David Seymour in the regiment of N.Y. Militia commanded by Col. Weeks in the war of 1812; that her said husband (6) was drafted at Little N.Y. on or about the 1st day of June, A. D. 1812, for the term of 12 months and continued in actual service in said war for the term of (7) 56 days, and whose service terminated, by reason of own health discharge at Loviston N.Y. on the 10th day of June, A. D. 1812. She further states that the following is a full description of her said husband at the time of his enlistment, viz: (8) Age 34 years Occupation farmer, Born in Wynouth Conn. Height 5 ft 8 in. Hair dark brown Eyes blue Complexion light. She further states that she was married to the said Luman Lovettland at the city (or town) of Saugus in the county of Broome and in the State of New York on the 23rd day of October A. D. 1815, by one (9) Timothy Clark who was a (10) Justice of the Peace and that her name before her said marriage was Leathia Clark and that she has not been married since the death of the said soldier; and she further states that (11) neither was she or her said husband previously married and that her said husband (12) Luman Lovettland died at Broome in the State of New York on the 2nd day of December, A. D. 1865; and she further declares that the following have been the places of residence of herself and her said husband since the date of his discharge from the Army, viz: (13) Saugus Broome Co. N.Y.

She makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the pension to which she may be entitled under the provisions of Sections 4736 to 4740 inclusive Revised Statutes, and the Act of March 3, 1878, and hereby constitutes and appoints with full power of substitution and revocation, John S. Cox of Canandaigua Ont. Co. N.Y.

her true and lawful attorney, to prosecute her claim and she further declares that she has heretofore made no application for (14) a pension but obtained a Land Warrant in his lifetime

and that her residence is No. 10 street, city (or town) of Saugus county of Broome State of New York

and that her post-office address is Saugus Broome Co. N.Y. That by reason of old age and being permanently feeble she asks if it can be by a Justice of the Peace
